gable de rebecca gablé born 25 september 1964 is a german author of historical fiction gablé is best known for her medieval chivalry romances she also works as a literary translator from english after leaving school in 1984 she embarked on a one year apprenticeship as a trainee bank clerk the one year apprenticeship became four a gable is the generally triangular portion of a wall between the edges of intersecting roof pitches the shape of the gable and how it is detailed depends on the structural system used which reflects climate material availability and aesthetic concerns the term gable wall or gable end more commonly refers to the entire wall including the gable and the wall below it gable helps you source book manage remote workspaces for your distributed teams a simple portal for your employees and a centralized management suite for hr and people operations make it easy for your team to search book and optimize use of flexible workspaces and company headquarters make sure you can support the workspace needs of your gable a standard gable is a slanted or pitched roof that creates flat areas on the front side or back of the house known as a gable homes can have multiple gables gable with dormer many gable roofs include a dormer which is a structure that protrudes from the flat wall of a house homes can have one or more dormers often with a gabled roof of their own

gable 'geɪbəl n 1 architecture the triangular upper part of a wall between the sloping ends of a pitched roof 2 architecture a triangular ornamental feature in the form of a gable esp as used over a door or window 3 architecture the triangular wall on both ends of a gambrel roof the gable roof is so common because of the simple design of the roof timbers and the rectangular shape of the roof sections this avoids details which require a great deal of work or cost and which are prone to damage if the pitch or the rafter lengths of the two roof sections are different it is described as an asymmetrical gable roof gable s technical design experts provide the preliminary engineering of projects including site surveying and troubleshooting to ensure structurally sound designs we translate our technical drawings into feasible design packaging that is ul and nec standard compliant clark gable in full william clark gable born february 1 1901 cadiz ohio u s died november 16 1960 los angeles california american film actor who epitomized the american ideal of masculinity and virility for three decades an enormously popular star during his lifetime gable was dubbed the king of hollywood early life and career gable triangular section of wall at the end of a pitched roof extending from the eaves to the peak the gables in classical greek temples are called pediments the architectural treatment of a gable results from the effort to find an aesthetically pleasing solution to the problem of keeping water out of the intersection of walls and roof this is accomplished either by carrying the roof 1 a the vertical triangular end of a building from cornice or eaves to ridge b the similar end of a gambrel roof c the end wall of a building 2 a triangular part or structure
